



Dear Representative Johnson,

A few years ago, we stopped by your office and spoke with Tom Hester of your staff. He told us that you were working on a bill to stop the annual ITIN fraud, \$6 billion in 2015. More recently, we've been in touch with Donald Davidson.

Unauthorized immigrants and their employers are at the core of our dilemma. Both parties gain from this relationship, but break the law—and American taxpayers pay the price. Our plan includes an enforceable methodology to tap these two resources for just a nickel apiece for every dollar paid to the immigrant.

The 1.7 million new American jobs and \$210 billion raised over 10 years will do a lot to fund education, healthcare, courts, and homeland security.

Speaker Ryan has discussed work permits—and this is what we need to do. We propose a special renewable 10-year work permit to be distributed once a nickel of each dollar of immigrant wages earned is collected from the immigrant workers and their employers.

The \$210 billion we generate from this fair tax (does not include visa overstays), will create 1.7 new American jobs and ease the pain of illegal immigration throughout the country.

It's time for a bipartisan, reasonable solution for immigration reform.
