



Dear Rob,

It's been wonderful seeing your interviews as of late, and follow your interest in keeping Malibu, *Malibu*. I've lived here since the mid-70s and have not always enjoyed watching the "progress."

I'm writing to you because you have a brain and a voice and you are not afraid to use them to make a point. There is a compassionate, viable, non-partisan solution to one of our nation's most serious problems, illegal immigration. It's not a political issue—it's all about taxes.

A brief personal bio follows so that you can see I am qualified to address the issues of taxes and budgeting, and I am compassionate about our immigrant situation. It's this trifold passion that led me to spend seven years developing a policy that is a compromise both parties can accept.

With our *third way* plan for immigration reform, our 11 million unauthorized immigrants could live here legally with access to medical care and other benefits, including being able to travel to their country of origin and return safely.

California will receive roughly \$43 billion—part of the revenue stream created by our policy that generates \$210 billion every 10 years. The money comes from small contributions from the immigrants themselves and their employers, and is to be used to fund our schools, health centers and other areas affected by illegal immigration. This is all outlined in our Vision (see <http://immigranttaxgroup.org/solution/>).

Rather than explain the details in a letter, I invite you to review our website. For a personal recommendation, you can ask the Yorks at the *Malibu Times* or young Senator Henry Stern, my left-handed pitcher and first baseman while I coached Little League.

This is a *real* solution and I'd like the opportunity to discuss the essence of the model with you, in the hopes that you also will embrace this fair, dignified, self-funding program, and help spread the word in support.
