



Dear Speaker Ryan,

The DACA solution will be much simpler once there is a plan in place for our 11 million unauthorized immigrants.

Last year you mentioned a work permit program. The Immigrant Tax Inquiry Group (ITIG) believes that this is a good solution, but that it can only succeed if it is monetized. The *third way* we've created answers the call.

Congress has looked at only half of the equation—our unauthorized immigrants—and blindly ignored the roughly 20 million Americans who hire them. These employers need to be part of the solution.

Our website explains how it's possible to collect a nickel each from both parties for every dollar paid in immigrant wages. This will yield \$210 billion over 10 years and can go a long way toward healing many of our nation's immigration problems.
